### **Reading Volunteers**

Many thanks to all families for supporting your children with reading at home. We are really starting to see some very competent and able readers coming through now and it is so good to know that they are enjoying everything that they are reading.

We do ask that children read 5 times a week and that parents sign the contact books in Key Stage 2 and Reading Diaries in Key Stage 1. If you see another signature appearing in your child's books, these will be from the brilliant team of Reading Volunteers that are helping out here at CPS. It is a fantastic opportunity to help our children become confident, fluent readers. Thanks to everyone for your ongoing support.

**Special Educational Needs** - If your child has a learning disability, their special educational needs (SEN) can be met either in a mainstream school with extra support, or in a special school. If your child has special educational needs, they will be able to access help, called SEN support, from:

- nurseries or childminders
- schools
- further education institutions, such as colleges and 16-19 academies

Children and young people with more complex needs might instead need an education, health and care (EHC) plan. You can find out how to get local support through your local authority website and search for 'local offer'.

**Getting SEN support** - You may be contacted if your nursery/childminders, school or college think your child needs SEN support. In school, for example, this will be by your child's teacher or special educational needs coordinator (SENDCO) – Mrs Satongar. You can also approach school/nursery etc. if you think your child might have SEN.

**Communicate with your child's teachers** - Getting involved with your child's school will help them get the support they need. Let us know what's going on at home. Explain your priorities for your child and how he or she is doing at home, so that we, as a school, can build on this. Your views and involvement will be needed throughout the process and you will be kept up to date with the progress made. Young people aged 16 to 25 will be fully involved in designing their own SEN support and provision.

**A four-stage process** - Getting SEN support happens in four stages. These are: **Assess, Plan, Do, Review**

**Assessing your child's needs** – Please talk to your child's teacher or the special educational needs coordinator (SENDCO) about getting an assessment. Mrs Satongar, our SENDCO, can spend some time with your child to work out what kind of extra support they might need. If necessary, other specialists, like a psychologist, may be involved.

Every child's SEN needs are different, depending on what kind of difficulties they have and how serious these are. We are here to help and will happily support in any which way we can. Please come and speak to us if you have any concerns and we will do our utmost to support you and your child in school.

**Transition Visits to TCA** – Many thanks to staff from CPS and also TCA for their input in ensuring that our Year 6 children have the easiest and smoothest transition to High School. We all know just how scary a thought it is to close the chapter on one school, one they have known for most of their lives and open the next chapter on a brand new adventure at High School. It is great to know that with our super links we can make sure that our children know their new school very well indeed!

**Parents Consultation Evening** – We have our Spring term Parents Evening on **Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February**. We will be using our Text to Parents system and you will be able to book an appointment to see your child's class teacher to discuss their progress and attainment so far this year. Please can we ask that if you do require a lengthier appointment that you kindly arrange an alternative appointment time as we want to do our very best to ensure any unnecessary and lengthy waits.

**Parental Questionnaire 2018** – We will be asking all families to complete a questionnaire again this year as part of our self-evaluating school reviews. If you have anything that you believe will make a positive improvement to our school we will really be 'all ears'. Last year we had a tremendously high return of our questionnaires, which was hugely successful in bringing about many positive changes. In working together, we make our school a better place for us all. Thank you in anticipation of your support.
