Bikeability - Year 6 will be taking part in a Bikeability training course again next week. Bikeability is today's cycle training programme. It's like cycling proficiency, but better! It's about gaining practical skills and understanding how to cycle on today's roads. Bikeability gives everyone the skills and confidence for all kinds of cycling. At Level 1 new riders learn to control and master their bikes in a space away from traffic such as a playground or closed car park. Trainees will usually be trained in a group of 3-12, although some individual training may also be required at times.

- Level 1 prepare yourself and your bike for cycling
 - get on and off your bike without help
 - start off, pedal and stop with control
 - pedal along, use gears and avoid objects
 - look all around and behind, and control the bike
 - share space with pedestrians and other cyclists

School Swimming Lessons. - School swimming begins again on Tuesday afternoon for children in Years 5 and 6. Please ensure that all children have appropriate, labelled swimwear and a towel with them (no Bermuda swim shorts please). Please also leave any jewellery such as ear-ring studs and watches at home. We also ask that all children bring a coat with them for walking to and from the pool. Finally, we also kindly remind you that the children in the classes that swim in the very last swim session will not arrive back at school until 3.30pm, due to the County allocation of timetables. Many thanks for your support with school swimming.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS – If you believe that your child may be eligible to receive free school meals, please contact us to find out what you need to do.

Even if your child is in Key Stage 1 and will be able to automatically receive a universal free school meal, it is still very important to complete a free school meal application if your circumstances warrant this as the school will receive valuable funding to support your child in school.

If you are in any doubt at all, please just ask in the main office.

Please remember that there is no need to provide a Key Stage 1 child with a packed lunch. We are able to provide every single child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 with a free, fully funded school meal. There is always a selection of hot meals available and of course, if your child would prefer a sandwich, then they can have this too! We are really keen to let families know that we can and do provide a tasty assortment of sandwiches, should your child prefer a packed lunch at lunchtime.

PARENTPAY - REMINDERS:

1. If your child is in Key Stage 2 and not eligible for a free school meal, you will need to have set up your ParentPay account in accordance with the "Activation Letter" sent home with your child at the end of last term.

- 2. If you still owe dinner money from last year, you will need to settle the debit balance that has been transferred to your ParentPay account before there are funds available for meals in September.
- 3. Under no circumstances will we be able to accept cash or cheque payments for school meals from the beginning of this term.

Spotlight on Reading

As I am sure most of you will agree the earlier children are able to read the better it is for them to access education. We are extremely keen to ensure that every child is a confident and secure reader and this journey starts very early indeed.


In our Early Years we encourage lots of talking, shared stories, story maps, nursery rhymes, songs with rhythm and rhymes, picture books and so on. As we move through into our Reception classes we focus on the deepening of understanding through the Ruth Miskin Phonics programme known as Read Write Inc.


The teaching of quality phonics is fundamental to securing good reading and at CPS we have had much success. Since the introduction of RWI 3 years ago, our children's attainment in the National Phonics Screening Checks is outstanding. Our children leave Year 1 with considerable phonetic skills and abilities and this is leading to a love of learning and a thirst for reading for pleasure.

As children move through Key Stage 1 they become confident readers and enjoy a wide range of reading books from their own class libraries and from our brilliantly resourced school library.

When children arrive in Year 3 and then throughout Key Stage 2 they move to the Accelerated Reader programme, whereby they complete a series of screening assessments and quizzes in order to improve their reading skills and develop good reading habits. Your child's teacher under the support of Mrs Wozniak, our School Librarian track individualized progress and then set goals in the AR programme.

We know that our systems for supporting reading are really having a positive impact on instilling a joy of reading for life and we hope that you can help share this love of reading with your children

- Your child has/will have received a welcome letter for their class; please contact the office if you require an additional copy. This is an important letter as it provides useful reminders and information for the year ahead.
- Please ensure all items such as PE kit, clothing, water bottles and sandwich boxes are clearly labelled
 with your child's name (please continue to check labels as ink can wear away quickly). Please also
 continue to update the school office team with any changes in contact details or medical conditions; we
 must have two current contacts for every child. (please remember to update changes to mobile phone
 numbers)
- School commences at 8:55am; school gates open either at 8.45am each day and children are
 encouraged to arrive on time via, the Tean Road gate or off the The Avenue entrance from 8:45am. In
 the morning. If you do need to speak to your child's class teacher please feel free to contact the office
 to arrange an appointment or catch one of the members of staff on the gate at the start of the school
 day and we will happily arrange contact.
- The signing-in and out system is located in the main office entrance. Any children who are late or have medical appointments will need to be signed in/out by parents. We do also need to see a copy of the medical appointment card or hospital letter. This system is compliant with GDPR regulations and ensures privacy for all pupils. The office staff will be happy to assist with its use as needed.
- Please also remember to check your school emails regularly. Our Text to Parents system helps with our communication especially when immediate contact is required.
- We would encourage all parents to spend time enjoying our school newsletter every Monday. Dates of
 events are included at the end of the newsletter and are always updated regularly as the school
 calendar adds in events. The school website also has term dates, INSET days and school events
 recorded on a regular basis.
- Our website is full of information regarding your child's class and the wider school community; there are engaging learning activities to explore with your child.
